

This includes a large selection of training materials developed or collected by project partners, but also reports, materials with datasheets, analysis, policy recommendations, as well as business models, funding sources, project development and implementation steps characteristic for each of the technological solutions. The resources of the Learning Centre are divided into several chapters, to make browsing easier. They also include materials in seven other languages than English (Croatian, Czech, German, Latvian, Serbian, Slovenian and Ukrainian).
